- The parallels with Christianity and the Stoic divine
- Controlling our emotions and neurochemicals
  - A general feeling around a situation vs the first movement

- Simon turned off his fossil gas furnace until next winter.
- Larry has been doing his daily reflection, and has been giving up on anger over drivers that fail to drive safely around bicyclists.

- John has been working on his judgment of his first impressions.
- Niyant has been practicing recognizing what problems that come up at work are in his control.
- Michael B. has been asking himself questions of reflection at the end of each day.
- Takako took a cold shower when she needed to, knowing it was good for her.
- Saba changed the object of her anger from external things to herself where she has control.
- Gwen has been trying to stop trying to change people's opinions.
